Join us this St David's Day by doing your own little act of Welshness, and sharing it on social media.


What makes an act of Welshness?


- It's a little thing that's easy to do

- And, above all else, it makes someone's day, or the world, just that little bit better


We'll be showcasing dozens of these acts in the run up to 01 March to inspire people.

Other countries have to make do with stripes, but we've got a dragon on our flag! And when you've got something that cool, you wave it with pride, wherever you are. each one with a unique message.


Give someone a spoon

Give a cwtsh Like a cuddle, but so much better. Pronounced 'kutch', to rhyme with 'butch', a cwtsh means so much to us Welsh.


Don your Welsh hat Wear a *het Gymreig* — our traditional Welsh hat — with style.

Play Tippit


Get together with five friends, a coin, and a table for this centuries old pub game.

Bake some picau ar y maen (which translates as 'cakes on the stone', as


Bake some *picau ar y maen* (which translates as 'cakes on the stone', as they were originally cooked on a heated bakestone) to share with friends, family or colleagues.




Gwlad, Gwlad!


Sing it solo, belt it out with friends or blast it on a random instrument. Extra points for learning the second and third verse!
